





Background Investigations

- Why Initiate Background Investigations?
- Is it worth the time and effort?



 Yes, pre-crash information that is relative to the causation of the crash and or death and to retrace the pre-crash path of travel for the vehicle.



Science

A study of the physical universe includes the analysis of forces and the affects of the forces on the movement of objects.

Force: A force is an action on an object that tends to change an objects state of motion.

The study of forces enables crash investigators to predict how forces affect the motion of vehicles.

> Forces are instrumental in the dynamics of vehicles.



Impairment vs. Under the Influence



Charges

DUI Manslaughter -316.193(3)(c)(3)

Defendant drove (or was in APC) of a vehicle. While driving (or in APC), Defendant:


Was under the influence of alcohol, a chemical, or controlled substance to the extent their normal faculties were impaired. Had a BAC of .08 or more.

As a result of operating the vehicle, Defendant caused or contributed to the cause of death of the Victim (or unborn quick child).

Vehicular Homicide – 782.071

Victim is dead / unborn child is dead by injury to mother/ an unborn child is dead. The death was caused by the operation of a motor vehicle by defendant. The defendant operated the motor vehicle in a reckless manner likely to cause the death of or great bodily harm to another person.

Note, this is essentially Reckless Driving with the additional element of a death. Also, no "intent" to harm the victim is required. The offense requires proof of a "willful or wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property."








