Update on TIM Initiatives:

National/State/Regional

Rory Howe presented to the team about "Making the Connection between the National Traffic Incident Management (SHRP-2) training and Connected Vehicles."

About the National Traffic Incident Management (SHRP-2) Research:

- Congress authorized the SHRP 2 in 2005 to investigate the underlying causes of highway crashes and congestion in a short-term program of focused research
 - Safety
 - Reliability
 - Renewal
 - Capacity
- The National TIM Responder Training Program is the first reliability product being rolled out under SHRP-2

Safety Research:

- Unprecedented data on driver behavior
- Naturalistic driving study
- Demographic backgrounds
- Physical, psychological and medical conditions

Renewal Research:

- Filled in the gaps in research and development (R&D)
- Alternative methods of providing DOTs more information to deliver projects faster and easier

- Simplify access to info on best practices.....
 - Performance measures
 - Utilities
 - Interaction with RR's
- Can speed up project delivery or address causes for delays

The US Department of Transportation advances deployment of connected vehicles to prevent hundreds of thousands of crashes.

- National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA):
 - -2015 = 35,092 deaths across the US.
 - 7.2% increase over 2014
 - 94% human choice or error

Charles Stratton informed the team about the 2017 National Work Zone Awareness Week which will take place April 3-7, 2017. National Work Zone Awareness Week is an annual spring campaign held at the start of construction season to encourage safe driving through highway work zones. The key message is for drivers to use extra caution in work zones.

Brandy Boccuti informed the team about the 2017 Lifesavers National Conference that will take place March 26-28-2017 in Charlotte, North Carolina. The theme for the 2017 conference is "Celebrating 35 Years of Delivering Solutions to Today's Critical Highway Safety Problems." Lifesavers is the premier U.S. highway safety meeting dedicated to reducing the tragic toll of deaths and injuries on our nation's roadways. Drawing over 2,000 participants in 2016, Lifesavers continues to be the "must attend" conference since its start in 1982. Each year, Lifesavers provides a forum for the presentation of proven countermeasures and initiatives that address today's critical highway safety problems.

Lee County Emergency Management presented to the team on the Southwest Florida Regional Evacuation Planning Effort. Below are some key points that were made during the presentation:

- Most difficult area of the county to evacuate by Atkins North America 2012
- Labeled as a Special Hurricane Preparedness District by FDEM
 - High risk of storm surge inundation
 - Extremely high regional evacuation times
 - Limited roadway capacity
 - Limited sheltering capacity
 - Large mobile and manufactured home populations
 - Large elderly population

The Lee County, West Coast, and Broward County, East Coast, surge zones and evacuation times maps were compared. The map showed Lee County having a large disadvantage and being more prone to flooding and surges.

Next Steps:

Additionally, the possibly of having fuel trucks to help first responders during emergency evacuation events was discussed.

Also, the Florida Department of Transportation is analyzing hurricane evacuation strategies and looking at implementing a hard shoulder evacuation lane instead of contraflow.

Contraflow lanes utilize the lanes normally dedicated to the opposite direction of travel whereas hard shoulder running allows through traffic to travel on existing shoulders. In regards to the hard shoulder lanes, one of the shoulders will be designated for the traveling public and the other shoulder would be used for emergency responders.

Lastly, There will be a regional table-top exercise taking place in March 2017, in Lee County, which will include representatives from all 10 counties in the region. One of the breakout sessions that will be included in the meeting is transportation issues.
