<u>Call to Order</u>: The Sarasota-Manatee TIM Team meeting was held virtually on Tuesday, October 13, 2020 at 1:30 PM via GoTo Meeting. Tom Arsenault and Brandy Boccuti facilitated the meeting.

<u>Introductions:</u> The team members provided their name and agency in the chat box for introductions and meeting attendance record.

Brandy Boccuti informed the team that the virtual TIM Team meeting is being provided to the TIM Team stakeholders to allow the opportunity to connect safely during this COVID19 time.

Additionally, the virtual meeting guidelines where reviewed with the team to help the meeting run more smoothly.

Agency News:

Road Rangers

The team was informed that the Road Rangers will have Road Ranger Tow trucks added to their fleet. The tow truck capability will allow the Road Ranger to safely move a vehicle blocking/obstructing traffic safely off the Roadways.

The team was also informed that the Road Ranger coverage has been extended to include 7:00 p.m. – 11:00 p.m.

Other Agency News

The TMC informed the team that they are still partially remote and have operators located at each of the center during daytime hours. Additionally, the TMC is working towards transitioning additional staff.

The TMC also address the following TIM Team member chat box question: How far down from a single lane closure traffic incident does the DMS signs provide advance warning to the traveling public. Ray informed the team on a single lane closure the DMS signs are activates 20 miles downstream, a full lane closure is 50 miles downstream, and a severe full lane closure the DMS signs will be activated even further, as needed, to provide appropriate notification.

The Fire Department shared their concern with the team in regards to a recent incident on I-75 at Mile Marker 215 in regards to access to an overturned vehicle. The responders were unable to easily access the traffic incident due to a jersey barrier. The fire agency requested guidance in the best protocol to request emergency access for first responders. The recommendation to the team was to notify the TMC of the situation as most contractors will temporarily remove the barrier or help in certain circumstances.

Additionally, there was also a request for the best protocol to request an emergency access turn arounds. The team was informed there is a list of locations that have been submitted for approved access points and this topic will be updated in future meetings.

Update on TIM Initiatives:

Tom Arsenault, Metric Engineering, informed the team about the Florida TIM Responder Newsletter. The FDOT TIM program publishes a quarterly newsletter called "Florida TIM Responder" containing articles related to Traffic Incident Management. The newsletter includes topics/articles from all Florida Districts; 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and Turnpike. Tom Arsenault, Metric Engineering, informed the team protecting the traffic scene. During a recent incident in District One it was observed that the cone tapering could have been extended further to the front of the scene to protect a Florida Highway Patrol vehicle and the trooper. The trooper was observed getting out of his vehicle as an oncoming vehicle almost struck his vehicle. The asset management on scene was contacted and a request was made to extend the MOT beyond the work zone. The picture on the left shows the cone tapering ending before the troopers vehicle. The picture on the right shows the cone tapering being extended past the trooper's vehicle.





Tom Arsenault, Metric Engineering, informed the team that on August 3, 2020 around 2:30 a.m. Road Ranger, Yosvanys Hernandez while on routine patrol came across a serious crash involving a tractor-trailer and one other vehicle. The driver of the tractor-trailer advised Mr. Hernandez that he had moved an unknown male that was ejected from the vehicle from the roadway in fear that traffic would hit him. Additionally, Mr. Hernandez was advised that there were other victims in the vehicle. Both the truck driver and Mr. Hernandez worked quickly removing the unresponsive female passenger by cutting their seatbelt and removing them from the vehicle. As they observed smoke starting to come out from underneath the hood of the vehicle, they then turned their attention to the unresponsive driver at which time a deputy arrived at the scene and was able to suppress the fire long enough for them to remove him from the vehicle. A certificate of appreciation will be presented to Road Ranger Hernandez for a job well done.

Tom Arsenault, Metric Engineering, informed the team that FDOT District One has implemented a Major Incident Evaluation breakout meeting(s) to review any major traffic incident that involved a fatality, wrong-way driving, and/or any major lane closure incident within 7 days of the incident. Participation in the meetings include an FHP representative. The evaluation includes a thorough investigation of the incident(s) to identify any solutions to reduce and/or prevent the incidents in the future.

Brandy Boccuti informed the team that District One is currently conducting the 2020 FHWA TIM Team Self-Assessments (TIM SA's). The TIM Self-Assessments are through the Florida Highway Administration (FHWA) and all TIM Teams throughout the nation participate in the self-assessments which are used to evaluate the progress of the teams and help set goals for the teams.

The Self-Assessments are usually completed during the TIM Team meetings. However, due to COVID19 feedback to the survey is being completed via online and will be sent to the corresponding TIM team stakeholders.

Brandy Boccuti reminded the team about the upcoming 2020 National Traffic Incident Response Week which will take place November 9-16, 2020.

National Traffic Incident Response Awareness Week is chance for all responder communities to individually and jointly make a difference by teaching each other, and the motoring public, about our common goal and responsibility to one another.

In the past three years, state DOTs, Turnpike Authorities, and responder agencies and organizations marked Incident Response Week with:

- Targeted DMS messaging
- Ride-along opportunities
- Video Sharing
- Social Media Campaigns
- Open House
- Special Exercise Activities



Lessons Learned:

- This was a rolled over coconut truck.
- The MOT truck that was responding received a flat on the way to RISC. This caused a delay for all equipment on scene.
- The NTP was given even though no MOT Truck.
- All lanes were open under an hour after NTP given. Same time the MOT Truck arrived.
- Good communications between units on scene and TMC.
- RISC activated quickly by TMC.
- Good job clearing scene once we achieved roadway clearance, which allowed normal flow quickly.
- Crews continued to work (Picking up coconuts) on shoulder.
